

PATRON SAINT REPORT AND PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

Reports and Presentations will be on Thursday, November 17.

This rubric is to be used as a guide while researching your saint. You are required to write a report *in your own words* and create a presentation to honor your saint. Reports and posters that are incomplete or plagiarized (remember the words: 'Thou shall not steal') will not be accepted and will be returned until deemed authentic. Don't procrastinate. This project will be much more meaningful if you take your time and do your research. Choose a saint that is truly special to you. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you!

Your Report... (25pts)

Be sure to include most of the following details in your report:

- When he/she lived
- Where he/she lived
- Important facts about the saint's life such as their feast day, their special devotions and symbols for which they are known
- Miracles (Can you find the 3 miracles needed for canonization?)
- Canonization date
- Stories/events that are important from his/her life
- Why you chose this particular person
- What you admire about him/her
- How was this person like Jesus Christ
- How do you plan to follow him/her as a role model

Your Presentation... This is your chance to get creative! (25pts)

Your presentation can include...

- A power point (you can email this to me, Ms. Radio, at hradio@stpeterskc.org)
- A poster
- A clay sculpture
- Dressing up
- voicethread.com – this is one way to create your presentation using technology
- blabberize.com – another way to use technology to present your saint
- a video you create (use youtube.com)
- podcast
- Or something of your own choice, or a multiple of these ideas

Some ideas to include in your presentation (poster, power point, etc.)...

- Draw or cut out pictures of the saint's attributes. (**Attributes** are objects that are always seen in pictures with the saint and associated with them; for example, St. Francis of Assisi is always seen with animals around him and wearing a brown tunic and St. Patrick is seen with a three leaf clover and wearing green).
- Show **pictures** of the people or countries that the saint is patron(ess) of.
- Create your own **prayer** for your saint or find a prayer that honors him/her or a prayer that the saint wrote him/herself. For example, the Breastplate prayer for St. Patrick.
- Add a **timeline** of the saint's life.
